2019 Results and Reflection With 10 Year Prior History

This has been a year of accomplishment for us as a school and program. Coming out of 2018 we reflected on some areas of concern and came up with initiatives to address them. As you go through this report it is clear that we made major strides forward. They were:

Focus on character—how we treat each other and academic honesty—re-visit our policy as a staff and then educate our students, Incredible bond inter-class and among all-We don't lose anyone, Focus on the IB Learner Profile and really integrating it throughout the program, An exceptional, community changing CAS Project preferably including elements of International Mindedness, Develop and hold a stress management/mental health workshop in collaboration with our school psychologist and counseling dept, IB Group-chat or 24/7 helpdesk-- Group/Peer Support system--4 seniors-4 juniors, Carry out an honest reflection on our program through the self-study process

Many of you shared your esteem for the junior and senior group. Unsurprisingly, they really embraced taking our program to the next level and in general they were/are so full of character and drive that being successful was part of their group identity; together with a strong concern for the well-being of their fellow IB'ers.

As coordinator I had one of the most pleasant experiences in my 12 years working with them and all of you. The results were excellent. Half of the group earned 30 or more points with Megan Fu earning the highest awarded score of 35 this year. 18 of the 20 Full Diploma candidates earned the diploma. The class of 2020 and certificate candidates did very well, boding well for 2020.

Commendations: 13 of the 15 subjects we offered this year improved their pass rate from last year and 9 of 15 subjects earned a 100% pass rate. Our overall pass rate was 93%. 90% of our students who were pursuing the Full Diploma earned it. Dance tested for the first time as a new subject to our school. 5 of the 19 math SL students earned 7's (the only subject earning 7's this year), Biology SL has made significant improvement over the past 3 years with pass rate, and most of our subject areas are above or near the world wide average.

Getting through the 5 Year Self-Study this past year was no small feat. I am grateful for everyone's participation and input during the process. Last week I was able to speak with Kelsey Day, our IB World School's manager, about the report and recommendations in it. I asked her what her honest evaluation of the report was—she assured me that we are doing great as a school and as a program and have so much to be proud of.

It's been a great year and you are a great team!

We can't rest on our laurels—there is much to do to maintain and improve on what we have accomplished and we (and IB) have identified quite a number of areas to focus on this coming year—I will be sharing our Action Plan at our opening staff meeting. We also have 37 juniors this year, the biggest junior class we've had in many years, and there is still the possibility of more enrolling before the year starts.
